## **Dear Patient: This is important to read:**

- Everyone shares some risk of getting colon cancer. If you have formed polyps, or if there is colorectal cancer in your family, your risk is greater.
- Colonoscopy can decrease, but not totally eliminate this risk. If you notice a change in your bowel movements, bleeding, or anything unusual before your next exam is due, call this office.
- Be sure your family members discuss with their physician, the screening exam best for them.
- If you found the prep excessively difficult, we can try a different 'laxative' next time.

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
